5. Pipe cleaners and wiki-sticks.
6. Arrival Activities: Table puzzles, giant games that are not deconstructing, coloring sheets or a permanent i-spy of kitschy items around a bulletin board or on a doorframe.
7. Make your own You Tube video of a scripture story.
8. Sneaky cards, Faith Word Teasers or other conversation cards.
9. Tell the scripture story with Glow sticks, chalk on the ground or make your own slide show.
10. Download online Highlight for children sheets, highlight for children coloring sheets or make your own.
